### YOU NEED TO KNOW

- Students with an academic deficiency are required to enroll in all necessary supplemental courses during their first two semesters at NKU.
- Students may take not more than two (2) courses of the same prefix in completing Foundation of Knowledge requirements, and no more than one (1) prefix in any main category. Courses taken to fulfill the Written Communication categories are not counted toward this policy. Foreign languages are collectively treated as a single prefix and therefore only one (1) can be used toward completion of the Culture & Creativity category.
- The Oral Communication, Written Communication I & II, and Mathematics & Statistics sub-categories should be completed in the first 45 credit hours.
- Some categories may contain one or more courses that also fulfill requirements for your major and/or minor. Some programs may require a minimum grade in these courses that is beyond what is required by the Foundation of Knowledge program. Consult your advisor.
- Details on this checklist are subject to change including course rotation and availability, pre-requisites, and/or course credit hours. Maintain contact with your assigned advisor to make sure you remain informed of any such changes.
