WAYS THAT TYPE HAPPENS ON THE WEB

TEXT IN IMAGES

- uses fonts in graphic files (jpeg, png, svg)
- visually limitless
- unsearchable on their own; capable of searching when used in combination with varied css techniques

WEB-SAFE FONTS

- makes use of system fonts already on the viewer's device(s)
- · choices are limited
- universal access
- free

EMBEDDING SERVICES


- serves up fonts on a remote server made available by a thirdparty provider
- relatively simple
- techniques vary based on the provider
- many choices
- can be both free and fee-based
- licenses potentially sticky
- fee-based have higherquality fonts


@FONT-FACE EMBEDDING

- serves up fonts to the viewer that are placed on the server that hosts the web site
- techniques vary
- requires appropriate licensing /ownership of font files
