- Successfully complete at least 45 semester hours of upper-division courses (those numbered at the 300 level or higher.)
- Complete all requirements of the Foundation of Knowledge (general education) curriculum for the applicable catalog year (see Foundation of Knowledge checklist).
- Complete all curriculum requirements for the ir
- Earn all of the following grade-point averages:
 - 2.75 or higher for all college coursework combined. (OR, if admitted under the 30-hour rule, 2.75 or higher for all college coursework combined starting from the last 30 credit hours attempted before admission to the Teacher Education Program.)
 - 2.75 or higher for all coursework attempted at NKU. (OR, if admitted under the 30-hour rule, 2.75 or higher for all coursework attempted at NKU starting from the last 30 credit hours attempted before admission to the Teacher Education Program.)
 - o 2.75 or higher in all Professional Education Courses.
 - o 2.75 or higher in all teaching field courses (where applicable.)
- Successfully complete the Clinical Experience, the Teacher Work Sample, and a final portfolio check
