Financial Aid at a Glance By: Veronica Joiner

Upon entering college, you're presented with what may seem like an overwhelming amount of information about this important time in your life. Added to that load of information often includes navigating the world of financing a college education for the first time. Properly planning and gaining an understanding of the options for funding college are some of the most important steps new college students and their families can take towards college preparedness. The NKU Office of Student Financial Assistance is here to guide families through the financial aid and scholarship process, from the beginning stages during senior year in high school, to the final days before becoming a college graduate.

The Office of Student Financial Assistance administers scholarships, along with federal, state and institutional financial aid programs for our students. NKU awards more than \$1 million in academic scholarships each year to the incoming freshman class to highly motivated students who demonstrate strong academic performance and meet merit based guidelines. Scholarship opportunities don't end after freshman year has passed; continuing and transfer students also have the opportunity to apply for competitive academic scholarships during the early part of the each academic year's spring semester.

In addition to scholarship opportunities, students are highly encouraged to file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to apply for additional financial aid. Guided by the US Department of Education, NKU administers millions of dollars in financial aid to qualifying students. From need-based aid such as the Federal Pell Grant to affordable loans including Federal Direct Subsidized, Unsubsidized and Parent PLUS loans, completing the FAFSA each year is the best way to assess financial aid eligibility.

Our goal is to share information and options to make the financial aspect of college manageable and more affordable for students and their families. If you or your student are uninsured and think you would benefit from applying, the time is NOW. There are informational pages you can print to assist you through the process. Applications can be <u>online</u>, on paper, by phone or in person. Interpreters are available.

A Quick Look at the Inclement Weather Policy

The past few months have kept the snow plows busy on the roads of Northern Kentucky, and as a result many parents have reached out to the Office of New Student Orientation and Parent Programs seeking clarification regarding the inclement weather policy.

Adverse weather, especially during the winter months, will not affect University operations and classes scheduled unless one or more of the following additional conditions occur:

- Campus facilities are damaged and determined unsafe.
- Essential utilities, such as heat and electrical service, are lost.
- Extremely hazardous travel conditions exist.



There is much discussion that goes on about these three conditions between the decision makers prior to making the call. But ultimately, the safety of our students, faculty, and staff is always the top priority. The university will make the best decision at that time given the best information available at the moment. Typically NKU will follow Campbell County's advisories when it comes to closings/delays.

Hopefully we are nearing a point in which we can put away our snow boots for next year, but this information also applies when dealing with other weather threats, such as flooding, severe storms, etc.
