- Encourage your student to contact the course professor during office hours. Office hours
 are listed on the course syllabus. The professor may be able to suggest different ways to
 study or learn the information. Making a connection with the professor can also show the
 professor that the student is interested in learning and achieving success in the course.
- 2. Utilize <u>Learning PLUS</u> to access tutoring, the Writing Center and supplemental instruction *for free!*
- 3. Make an appointment with <u>University Connect & Persist</u> (UCAP). Your student can meet with a member of the UCAP team to discuss academic success, navigating finances, and more.

SPRING ADVISING APPOINTMENTS

It's hard to believe that the opportunity to register for Spring 2021 courses is just around the corner. To prepare, encourage your students to:

- 1. Log into myNKU and check their holds status. Your student will want to take action to get any holds removed so that they will be able to register for classes.
- 2. Check their <u>registration date</u>. This will help your student determine the first date they will be eligible to register for classes.
- 3. Schedule an <u>advising appointment</u>. Students need to meet with an advisor prior to registering, and advising times can fill up quickly!
