- The logo I made is a red-eyed tree frog for this assignment. As you can see, it is a simple design of a frog but it is filled with many mathematical elements. The first image is the draft and the second image is the finished product. When looking at the frog, it was made to be as symmetrical as could be drawn. The shape of the frog has one line of reflection symmetry. If drawn a line vertically through the middle of the frog, the logo could be folded onto by the line to be completely symmetric. The rectangular stripes on the frog can be considered parallel lines. The logo itself is not entirely simple or made of clearly defined shapes like heptagons.
